




The emergency management continuum






The emergency management continuum




The emergency management continuum

Version 1.0: 30 APR 2009







The emergency management framework in Australia



Who is AHA?

- A not-for-profit public company established by government and livestock industries
- Incorporated in 1996
- 32 members in five categories:
 - Australian Government
 - All the state (6) and territory (2) governments
 - Livestock industry organisations (15)
 - Service providers (2)
 - Associate members (6).



What do we do?

- Scope of our activities
 - Initial focus on emergency animal diseases (EADs), now much broader
- Mission
 - To assist our members and partners to enhance, strengthen and protect animal health and the sustainability of Australia's livestock industries
- Four service streams
 - EAD Preparedness and Response
 - Market Access Support
 - Biosecurity Services
 - Corporate and Member Services.






EAD confirmed in Australia



Response plans – some examples

- Australian Nuclear Science and Technology Organisation Emergency Response Plan
 - the framework for responding to all incidents and accidents at the Lucas Heights nuclear research reactor
 - provides arrangements for coordinating the response by ANSTO and NSW Emergency Services organisations, such as police, fire and ambulance
- NSW State Emergency Management Plan
 - preparedness, response and recovery arrangements to ensure coordinated responses by all emergency agencies.







Common elements of response plans

- Introduction
 - Aim/purpose
 - Scope
 - Authority
- Roles and responsibilities
 - Within the organisation and with external organisations
- Coordination arrangements
 - Response phases
 - Organisational structures
 - Information management
 - Communication
- Public Information
- Administration.



AUSVETPLAN Enterprise Manual for meat processors

- Target groups:
 - emergency disease decision-makers at state or national level who are unfamiliar with meat processing operations — the manual aims to provide both an overview of the meat processing industry and also guidance on appropriate policy and applicable procedures
 - meat processing industry staff and veterinarians who need specific information on how to perform operational tasks to exclude, contain or eradicate the disease, and how to prepare contingency plans for their specific enterprises.



AUSVETPLAN Enterprise Manual for meat processors

- Applicable:
 - when a meat processing establishment is operating in the vicinity of an EAD outbreak
 - when an **EAD** is detected in an animal in an abattoir or contaminated products are detected in a processing plant.




